


- A federation of Alberta naturalists

- Observe structures and docks, retaining walls, vegetation and habitat visible from water







#### Results

- Erosion is main issue that residents engage with our incentive
- Projects range from small projects 8 plants (8 m²) to 111 plants (144m²)
- Some people just want the information then want to implement on their own



### Successes

- Building a sense of community around projects
- Residents taking ownership of projects
- Word of mouth has been instrumental
- Building trust with our organization
- On-the-ground impact



## Challenges

- Permitting has multiple layers
- Bureaucracy when dealing with government
- Overcoming property owner's fear of unknown
- Elevating level of awareness around issues and property ownership e.g. MR/ ER



## Opportunities

- We will work with groups interesting in bringing this program to their lake
- We have a dedicated staff member, Shoreline Naturalization Technician, for the incentive program
